We are also interested in individuals who have never experienced financial fraud or scams.

## Participants must be:

- 50 years or older and fluent in English
- · No history of current or past substance abuse
- · No major problems with emotional functioning

## Study procedures may include:

- 1) In-Person Behavioral Data Collection: Pencil-paper and computerized measures examining thinking abilities, emotions, and health
- 2) Neuroimaging Session: Brain MRI scan
- 3) **Telephone Data Collection:** Phone and text-based measures of thinking, health, and relationships

Money will be given for participation. Transportation to and from study site can be provided if needed.
